

It is an evening such as this that allows us to honor these collective efforts and helps raise funds so that the SIF may continue its mission.

THE 2022 SIF LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD FOR PUBLIC SERVICE



Rosa DeLauro is the Congresswoman from Connecticut's Third Congressional District, which stretches from the Long Island Sound and New Haven, to the Naugatuck Valley and Waterbury. Rosa serves as the Chair of the House Appropriations Committee and sits on the Democratic Steering and Policy Committee, and she is the Chair of the Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education Appropriations Subcommittee, where she oversees our nation's investments in education, health, and employment.

At the core of Rosa's work is her fight for America's working families. Rosa believes that we must raise the nation's minimum wage, give all employees access to paid sick days, allow employees to take paid family and medical leave, and ensure equal pay for equal work. Every day, Rosa fights for legislation that would give all working families an opportunity to succeed.

Rosa believes that our first priority must be to strengthen the economy and create good middle class jobs. She supports tax cuts for working and middle class families, fought to expand the Child Tax Credit to provide tax relief to millions of families, and introduced the Young Child Tax Credit to give families with young children an economic lift.

Rosa has also fought to stop trade agreements that lower wages and ship jobs overseas, while also protecting the rights of employees and unions. She believes that we need to grow our economy by making smart innovative investments in our infrastructure, which is why she introduced legislation to create a National Infrastructure bank.

Rosa is a leader in fighting to improve and expand federal support for child nutrition and for modernizing our food safety system. She believes that the U.S. should have one agency assigned the responsibility for food safety, rather than the 15 different agencies that lay claim to different parts of our food system. Rosa fights against special interests, like tobacco and e-cigarettes, which seek to skirt our public health and safety rules.

As the Chair dealing with appropriations for Labor, Health, Human Services, and Education, Rosa is determined to increase support for education and make college more affordable for more American students and their families. She is also fighting to protect the Affordable Care Act so that all Americans have access to affordable care. Rosa strongly believes in the power of biomedical research and she is working to increase funding so that we can make lifesaving breakthroughs in science and medicine.

Rosa believes that we have a moral obligation to our nation's veterans and their families, and her concern for these heroes extends to both their physical and mental well-being. Rosa supports a transformation in how the Department of Veterans Affairs is funded, including advanced appropriations for health services, to ensure its fiscal soundness; and she successfully championed legislation to guarantee that troops deploying to combat theaters get the mental health screening they need both before and after deployment, as well as championed legislation that now provides assistance to today's Post-9/11 veterans choosing to pursue on-the-job training and apprenticeship programs.

Rosa belongs to 62 House caucus groups and is the co-chair of the Baby Caucus, the Long Island Sound Caucus, and the Food Safety Caucus.

Soon after earning degrees from Marymount College and Columbia University, Rosa followed her parents' footsteps into public service, serving as the first Executive Director of EMILY's List, a national organization dedicated to increasing the number of women in elected office; Executive Director of Countdown '87, the national campaign that successfully stopped U.S. military aid to the Nicaraguan Contras; and as Chief of Staff to U.S. Senator Christopher Dodd. In 1990, Rosa was elected to the House of Representatives, and she has served as the Congresswoman from Connecticut's Third Congressional District ever since.

Rosa is married to Stanley Greenberg. Their children—Anna, Kathryn, and Jonathan Greenberg—all are grown and pursuing careers. Rosa and Stan have six grandchildren, Rigby, Teo, Sadie, Jasper, Paola, and Gus.

Lidia Matticchio Bastianich is an Emmy award-winning public television host, bestselling cookbook author, successful restaurateur, and owner of a flourishing food and entertainment business. Most importantly, she has accomplished all of this by marrying her two passions in life—her family and food—to create multiple culinary endeavors alongside her two children, Joseph and Tanya.

Lidia has published numerous cookbooks, co-authored with her daughter Tanya, and companion books to her Emmy-winning television series *Lidia's Kitchen*, *Lidia's Italy in America*, and *Lidia's Italy*. Her most recent book is *Lidia's A Pot, A Pan, and a Bowl*, a companion to her new 26-part public television series, *Lidia's Kitchen: Home Cooking*. She is also the author of the English and Italian version of her memoir: *My American Dream: A Life of Love, Family, and Food*. Lidia's cooking shows air nationwide in the U.S. on public television and CREATE, internationally, and on various digital networks including Amazon Prime, Tubitv, and Xumo. Her cooking segments are also part of her TUTTOLIDIA YouTube channel.



Lidia is a celebrated chef and restaurateur and a partner in Eataly NYC, Chicago, Boston, Los Angeles, Dallas, Las Vegas, Toronto, and Sao Paolo, Brazil. Together with Tanya and son-in-law Corrado, she also developed a line of artisanal pastas and all-natural sauces called LIDIA'S.

Lidia is a member of Les Dames D'Escoffier and founding member of Women Chefs and Restaurateurs, two non-profit organizations of women leaders in the food and hospitality industries. She is also a champion for the United Nations Association of the United States of America's Adopt-A-Future program, in support of refugee education.

Among the numerous awards and accolades Lidia has earned are seven James Beard Awards (Outstanding Chef, Television Food Show, Best Chefs in America, Who's Who of Food & Beverage in America, Specials 2016, Special 2017 and 2018) and two Emmy Awards for Outstanding Culinary Host (2013 and 2018).

PHILANTHROPIST AND ENTREPRENEUR

THE 2022 SIF LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD IN ITALIAN AMERICAN LEADERSHIP



Angelo Vivolo is a philanthropist, entrepreneur, and lifelong advocate for educational opportunity and promoting and supporting his Italian Heritage and Culture. Angelo presently serves as the President of the Columbus Heritage Coalition, dedicated to preserving the legacy of Christopher Columbus. He was elected as the President of the National Columbus Education Foundation which is funded by the 5 most influential Italian American organizations in the country. He has served as past President and the Chairman of the Board of the Columbus Citizens Foundation and the Columbus Day Parade in NYC. His focus is on preserving Italian Heritage and Culture and supporting Columbus Day and Statues.

Recently he was nominated and elected as a member of the City University of New York Board of Trustees. CUNY and its 25 schools are the largest group of higher education institutions in the country. Mr. Vivolo serves on the Board of Directors of John Cabot University in Rome. As president of the Francesco and Mary Giambelli Foundation he leads a philanthropic organization that supports cultural programs in New York City schools which has funded more than \$3 million in scholarships.

In 2019 he was appointed to co-chair the Mother Frances Xavier Cabrini Statue Commission. Angelo is a 2005 recipient of the Ellis Island Medal of Honor, and the Ufficiale dell' Ordine al Merito della Repubblica Italiana, conferred by President Sergio Mattarella of Italy in 2018.

Mr. Vivolo, a graduate of Long Island University, started his professional career as a teacher in New York City public high schools in Brooklyn and Queens. He was appointed dean of a special intervention program for high-risk, academically underprepared teenage boys. He also took advanced courses in graduate programs at Hunter College and Brooklyn College.

After nearly a decade of teaching, Mr. Vivolo embarked upon a forty-year plus career in the hospitality industry as an acclaimed restaurateur and owner of five widely respected Manhattan restaurants. During this time, he served as a goodwill ambassador to New York's culinary industry, conducting seminars at public schools and supporting the culinary and hotel management program at the New York City College of Technology of the City University of New York. Angelo has supported scholarships for students at the Culinary Institute of America, where he delivered the 2017 commencement address.

Angelo is especially proud of having had the great honor of meeting with and directing all dining services for Pope Benedict in 2009. He also served Pope Francis in 2015 at the residence of the Nuncio during his three-day visit to New York City along with his dear friend Lidia Bastianich.

Angelo and his wife Denise of 44 years are blessed with a wonderful family and find special joy with their five grandchildren. They are inspired everyday by their loving family.

Laurie Cerricchio Hollander PRESIDENT & CO-FOUNDER HELP OUR MILITARY HEROES

THE 2022 SIF AWARD FOR COURAGE AND PATRIOTISM

Laurie Serricchio Hollander is President and Co-Founder of Help Our Military Heroes (HOMH), a 501(c)(3) whose mission is to provide fully equipped, adapted minivans and SUVs to our country's most severely wounded, injured, and ill service members who sustained their injuries while on active duty.

With her husband, Ted, and their friend, Marybeth Vandergrift, Laurie founded HOMH in 2009 as an all-volunteer donation-driven nonprofit organization. HOMH pays no salaries, and all non-program expenses are paid by its Co-Founders and board members, which means 100% of all donations go toward the purchase of modified vehicles for veterans. Since 2009, HOMH has provided grants for 186 modified vehicles for veterans across the country, and as far away as Pohnpei, Micronesia.

Laurie got the inspiration for HOMH in 2006, when her eldest son, Robert Wilkinson, left college during his junior year to enlist in the United States Marine Corps, and her younger son, Matthew, received an appointment to the United



States Military Academy at West Point. It was there, at a West Point football game in Michie Stadium, that Laurie witnessed a combat-wounded soldier, who was in a wheelchair as the result of an IED blast, being presented with a ramp-entry minivan during halftime. While she had been fundraising for several years for local organizations, she decided to switch gears and turn her efforts towards providing adapted vehicles for veterans in need.

After lending her support to other veteran themed non-profits from 2006-2009, HOMH had its first fundraising event as an official non-profit in early 2010, and experienced incredible support and success. It initially focused on serving wounded veterans from the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq, but has since grown to serve all pre- and post-9/11 wounded, injured, and ill veterans.

In 2015, HOMH was recognized as one of the top six grass roots, small military nonprofits by The Fisher House Foundation, Military Times, and Newman's Own Foundation. They received a significant grant at The 'Newman's Own' Grant Awards, held at The Pentagon Hall of Heroes. In 2016, HOMH received the Spirit of Ability Award from BraunAbility® for improving the lives of people with disabilities and making a difference in this world. And since 2014, HOMH has been a recipient of the extraordinary generosity of the Sons of Italy Foundation, which has provided over \$165,000 in grants and helped to fund vehicles for 12 veterans! Under Laurie's leadership, HOMH has raised over \$4,000,000 since its inception.

Prior to shifting her focus to philanthropic work, Laurie had built a successful career as a health and fitness coach and trainer, and fitness studio owner. She has competed in numerous events, including the US Tri-athalon National age group championships, Marine Corp, and other Marathons and has completed two full Ironman Triathlons (2.4 mile swim, 112 mile bike, 26.2 mile swim)in 2003 and 2012, both in Lake Placid, New York, to celebrate her 40^{th} and 50^{th} birthdays!

Laurie was born and raised in Stamford, Connecticut. Her paternal grandparents (the Serricchio and Collucci) and her father's older siblings emigrated from Avellino-Naples through Ellis Island, as did her maternal great-grandparents (the Ofiero and D'Aquila). She and her husband, Ted, have been married for 12 wonderful years and are both proud members of Valley Regional Lodge #151 in Derby, Connecticut. They spend much of their time creating memories with (and spoiling) their 4 grandchildren Audriana, Evangeline, Reed, and Ophelia.

She would also like to recognize their grandson, Gabriel, who passed away shortly after birth two years ago.



Since then, they have awarded 186 adaptive minivans to deserving veterans.

This year, the Sons of Italy Foundation (SIF) presented a donation of \$20,000 to HOMH. This year's donation marks the eighth time in nine years that the Sons of Italy Foundation has donated at least \$20,000 to HOMH. The donation provides a minimal grant for a veteran who was injured while on active duty. The recipient is to be determined.




